MUSIC MINISTER (Organist/Choir Director)

RESULT EXPECTED

The Music Minister will assist the Priest in leading the congregation in the worship of God, through promoting congregational participation through hymns, service music, and direction of the choir (s).

QUALIFICATIONS:

- The Music Minister should show evidence of having a passion for sacred music and for congregational worship.
- The Music Minister should have professional experience in musical performance (organ/piano) and in directing volunteer singers
- Useful skills for this position are the ability to listen to and communicate with people of all ages, the ability to work with leaders of other ministry groups, and interest in developing and sharing knowledge and passion for music.
- Preferred Qualifications: experience leading liturgical worship, fluency in traditional sacred music and newer hymnody and Christian music, leadership of bell choirs

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POSITION

The Music Minister will:

- 1. Provide organ and piano accompaniment for hymns and service music at the weekly Sunday service.
- 2. Select appropriate choral music and direct the church choir, including weekly choir practices. During periods when the choir is off, arrange for appropriate instrumental or occasional choral offerings.
- 3. Work regularly with the Priest to collaborate on the selection of music and to discuss ways to enhance congregational worship
- 4. Provide additional music as appropriate, including preludes, postludes, and the accompaniment of instrumentalists
- 5. Maintain the music library in an orderly fashion and maintain, at the church's expense, sufficient copies of music to enable the choir's full participation
- 6. Oversee the maintenance of the organ and the piano, notifying the Priest and vestry (church board) of necessary tuning and repairs and limiting access to the organ to trained organists as authorized by the Rector.
- 7. Be present in the buildings and facilities a minimum of seven hours a week when the choir is active (including Thursday choir rehearsal) and four hours a week when the choir is on vacation. The remainder of the work may be done on site or at home.
- 8. Provide music for funerals or weddings as negotiated
